Washburn Memorial Library world should be enabled June 1, 2023

Present were: Heidi Silver Londa Brown, Ed Jarrell, Sue Brown, Christina Maynard, Bev Turner, Cara Miller, Donna Turner, Sarah Sines

Chairperson, Christina Maynard, called the meeting to order at 4:30 PM.

<u>Secretary's Report:</u> Bev made the motion to accept the secretary's report. Londa seconded the motion. The secretary's report was accepted unanimously.

Financial Report: Donna reported out on the library's financial status. At this time of year the library needs to be at 33%, which it currently is. The "Library Allowance" line is slightly over budget, but this is due to a large payment out in January. "Technical Support" is always over budget due to a large payment out at the beginning of the year also.

There is some question about the library's furnace and how it may perform next year. A service plan has been purchased from Dead River, which will include a cleaning.

Starting July 1, 2023, there will be a change to the salary line. Cara's position will change to full-time. This is not currently reflected in the financial numbers.

Ed inquired about whether the library has its own checking account. Donna explained the library has 1 checking account.

The King Grant - All obligations tied to the grant have been fulfilled.

<u>Library Director's Report:</u> Cara emailed her April and May Stats, Memorials and Donations reports to the board members prior to the meeting. Gene and Londa Brown donated the materials for 2 raised beds located outside the door to the children's library. They were donated in loving memory of Kay Brown. Participants from Toddler Time worked together to plant the flowers. A great time was had by all. Plaques will be added to the tubs in the near future.

The Seed Library continues, however participation is lighter than last year.

Many Heirloom and organic seeds are still available. Keith Brown will advertise the Seed Library on the town sign. Information about the seed library has been posted on Facebook, but will be posted again in the near future.

Cara's Yoga class has met 4 times so far. There are on average 6 people in attendance. She anticipates more participants to join as time goes on.

Newsletter Update: Newsletters were sent by mass email to patrons. Approximately 150 emails were not able to be delivered. Atriuum IT support was contacted but they indicated their service is not meant to send out mass newsletters. Much time and effort went into this endeavor. Ed suggested when emails are sent in large bunches they are typically flagged as SPAM. Sending the newsletters in smaller batches may prove more successful. Another option would be to test sending emails utilizing the BCC option.

Cara and Courtney prepared letters inviting local businesses to participate in the library's Books & Baskets Raffle. A list of local businesses was provided. Board members will deliver or mail the letters.

Board members will donate a basket for the Books & Basket Raffle. Our theme will be Wildlife & Nature. All donations should be delivered to the library by mid-July.

Children's Librarian Report: The library will host a Scholastic Book Fair June 7-9, 13-15 from 9:30 AM until 4:00 PM. The library will open on Saturday, June 10 from 9:00 AM until 12:00 PM for people to visit the Book Fair. An invitation has been sent to the elementary school encouraging classes to visit the book fair.

Courtney is preparing this summer's reading program titled Bee A Reader. Sessions will be on Wednesdays on July 5, 12, 19 and 26 from 10:30 AM until 12:00 PM for ages 3 and up. At the end of the Summer Reading Program ladybugs will be released into the raised flower beds recently planted by the toddlers.

Toddler Time continues to see growth with up to 18 toddlers. Families from neighboring towns are attending.

Board Education: Londa educated the board about a recently released report titled The State of America's Libraries 2023 from the American Library Association. The report highlights challenges faced by public libraries in the United States, including rising censorship issues, increased social, political, financial and staffing stresses felt by local libraries. It was noted how important local libraries are in support of vulnerable populations in the community.


