Call to Order:

Chairperson Christina Maynard called the meeting to order at 5:01 PM via Zoom.

Secretary's Report:

Sue Brown moved to accept the secretary's report, seconded by Londa Brown. The motion carried unanimously.

Financial Report:

Donna Turner presented the financial report. Same belastical

Special Accounts:

Memorial books balance: \$34.89 – Most of the funds have been
 spent, as intended.

Library Projects Account:

- Miscellaneous donations balance: \$34.89.
- Ye Olde Book Shoppe account balance: \$216 \$790 was raised from book sales this year, which was fully allocated to the children's library.
- King Grant: Zero balance; Donna allocated \$27.04 to zero out the account.
 - Library projects received \$389.30 Clarification needed on the source (possibly August Festival artist sales or Partners for the Arts).

• Expense Summary Report:

- End-of-year numbers are nearly final, with a few overextended accounts.
- Half-year contribution to Maine State Retirement. Quidosci

- 4.5% salary increase for the director and children's librarian, the largest in recent years.
- o 9% increase in health insurance for all staff.

Next Year's Budget Adjustments:

- Electricity: \$2,500; Heat: \$2,000 (swap from previous year).
- Water/Sewer: Increased from \$960 to \$1,020.
- General supplies slightly over budget.
- o Library supplies balance: \$256.62.
- Dues & subscriptions to remain the same.
- Siv MSo Postage to increase slightly. Iso brangsM satisfied normalised
 - Training budget to remain at \$400. Courtney plans to attend of children's librarian training.

Special Events/Activities:

- Last raised from \$300 to \$1,000, considering an increase to \$1,300.
- Homeschooling group will be charged a fee, which will be reinvested in this account.
- Cara and Courtney agreed that \$1,300 should be sufficient.

Library Projects Account:

- Currently holds \$151, with no tax dollars allocated.
 - End-of-year remaining funds in the expense summary do not carry over.

Maintenance & Equipment: Wassey sing selection most besist

- Budget remains the same.
- Next month, Donna will provide an update on the Maine Community Foundation's 4th quarter statement.

Backup Power Discussion: 8 (6)/1867 (8)/1904 (Idiaeog) 8011/08

- During the last power outage, there were concerns about extended outages affecting the building.
 - Carlisle Energy is working on a solution to connect essential areas to backup power.

 Description of the solution of

- Proposal: Split costs with the Recreation Center to purchase two generators, estimated at \$2,000 total.
- The board will revisit this discussion next month.
