Secretary's report:

Laurie passed out copies of the minutes from the last meeting. Rita moved to accept and Londa seconded. Motion carried.

Financial Report:

91.67% of the budget has been used. There is less than a month to go in this year. Some line items have been used, but others are fine. A suggestion was made to cut the heat allowance and add the amount cut to the library allowance. Health insurance has gone up 9.25% The budget meeting is in February. Londa asked about increasing the Library allowance for next year's budget. The recommendation was made to move the heat excess, training excess and librarian excess into the library allowance. We need to use the fines (\$400) for things needed at the library or it gets rolled into the town's general account. There is also a "Friends of the Library" fund that has around \$800 in it.

Librarian's Report:

Lois will need another book cart in the new year. She also needs two memorial plaques for the audio shelves in memory of Glenice Huston. Circulation statistics are down for November and December most likely due to the holidays. Computer usage is going down. There have been many memorial and book donations. We may be able to sell duplicates in a book sale. There is a possibility of a continual book sale. It has been quiet, but steady.

New business:

OPAC is an online catalog of everything in the library. Is it possible to get that information to the public? We also have inter-library loan. We go through Bangor first and then other libraries.

The next meeting will be February 2, 2017 at 5:00 pm.

Meeting adjourned at 5:59. Christina moved and Charlotte seconded. Motion carried.

Washburn Memorial Library Report for 2016

"The only thing you absolutely have to know is the location of the library."

Albert Einstein

In this digital age the question might be "Why do we even need a library?" You can download just about any book, magazine or movie that you want. Everyone has a computer, an iPad, a Kindle, or a smart phone of some kind, right? No, and many have no access to the Internet. At the library you can borrow a book or magazine for two weeks, you can access the Internet to check your email, you can look for a job, you can get the forms that you need to report your income tax, you can borrow a movie for a couple of nights, you can make a puzzle, you can do homework, you can catch up with your neighbors, you can see an art exhibit, you can participate in story time, you can attend your Girl Scout meetings, you can get more familiar with using a computer, you can play computer games, you can report your work hours, you can photocopy, you can FAX, you can learn about a hobby, you can work on ancestral genealogy and the list could go on.

In April six people from the Maine State Library came for a librarian's workshop. The state has revised how they are going to offer support to the libraries throughout the state. It was an opportunity to work through some of the changes that were going to take place. The other libraries that were represented were Caribou, St. Agatha, Houlton, Van Buren and the Northern Maine Community College.

In May the temporary steps were installed by Mr. John Kelly from Bridgewater. For the time being we are ADA compliant. On May 21st teens from the Aroostook Aspirations Initiative spent the morning at the library moving the Maine section of books down stairs, then rearranged books on the main floor. They did an excellent job and were fast and efficient. Thank you for that help.

At the May Board of Trustees meeting it was decided to apply for another Steven King Grant to make the front steps completely ADA compliant. A special committee was set up to work on getting everything that was needed to apply for this grant. It was sent to the Steven King Foundation in mid June. In early September we were informed that the library had received the grant. Mr. Kelly was immediately contacted but he was unable to start on the new steps until spring of 2017. Along with the steps there will be a new outdoor drop box and a new sign. Look for these changes in the spring.

The summer reading program was entitled "Carry Out a Good Book" with a pizza theme. Seven children signed up to take part in the program. All of the children did well but two excelled each reading well over three hundred books for the summer.

During August festival Beth Brown had an art show here at the library. It was very well attended with many wanting to purchase her pieces.

In September and October Beth Brown shared puppet shows on Monday evenings.

In October Toddler Story time got going again with Jennifer Tanguay as the hostess. Every other Tuesday the room downstairs is brimming with excited toddlers and their parents or guardians. The children color, are read to, do crafts and have a snack. They sing and play games. With an average of 7 to 10 children each meeting the story time is proving to be a great time for all.

Girl Scouts continue to meet downstairs each Friday afternoon. The group has grown in numbers and they have added another leader. They average 12 to 15 girls each meeting.

The library added 42 new patrons to its roster this year, sixteen children, twenty-two adults and 4 non-resident adults. Almost 4,000 patrons came through the door in the year 2016. Computer usage continues to be high with 3,473 units of usage for the year. One patron borrowed 364 books just this year. The second highest amount of books taken out by one person is 244. Motor Mouth by Janet Evanovich, Light of the Moon by Luanne Rice and Illusion by Frank Peretti were borrowed the most for audio books. For DVD's and VHS, Despicable Me, The Lego Movie and Cloudy with a Chance of Meatballs were borrowed the most. In books for adults All Dressed in White by Mary Higgins Clark was borrowed 13 times, Without Warning by David Rosenfelt was borrowed 6 times and Rogue Lawyer by John Grisham was borrowed 6 times. In non-fiction books the two borrowed the most were The Johnstown Flood by David McCullough and Dog Tripping by David Rosenfelt. For children's books: The Story of Peppa Pig was borrowed 8 times, Pizza for Sam was borrowed 8 times and Disney Princess Look & Find was borrowed 8 times.

1,866 books were taken out of the library at least once this year.

This librarian is thankful to the Board of Trustees that offers advise and guidance for me in making the Washburn Memorial Library a vital part of the community.
