

Washburn Memorial Library **Board of Trustees Meeting** January 11, 2018 5:00 pm



Members in attendance: Rita Kingsbury, Charlotte Griffin, Donna Turner, Laurie Blackstone, Londa Brown, and Lois Walton.

Secretary's Report:

The minutes from the December meeting were passed around. Charlotte moved that we accept them. Motion carried.

Financial Report:

The Thompson Fund is up for renewal. (\$15,000) Bev talked to Ann Bragg about the fund and Ann had no limitations on the fund. Rita moved to move the fund to the Community Foundation Fund and use the yearly payout to purchase books etc. Charlotte seconded. Motion carried.

Donna called Thompson Masonry and he will give us a bid. The amount from the King grant is \$16,956.88. We may need to use money from the Randall fund to complete the step project.

The Misc. donations, memorial and fine monies need to be spent before the end of the year. \$848. Computer cost is \$740. Charlotte moved to accept the Treasurer's report and Rita seconded. Motion carried.

Librarian's report:

There is a list of memorials. Many books and money were donated. Statistics: It's been a quiet month. Less computer usage. Items added were 542. Donated books were 70. A list of the average cost of books is included. Lois and Londa feel that \$4000 isn't enough to keep up in this day and age. Rita suggested we look into a program that lets you borrow large print for a time since they are so expensive to buy. (Maine State Library) Other libraries use van delivery. Maybe we could have another library pick up our order.

New business:

Londa presented MARVEL, Maine's Virtual Library. It's free and we've had it for about 17 years. We need to understand and promote it. Challenge: Find it and log in by next meeting. Senior citizens love the program because it has ancestry on it. We could do a program for senior citizens since it only can be accessed at the library. Tech Soup is a national name. We will use Tech Stew as ours. Londa has started creating flyers and business cards. She has also contacted teachers about using NHS students to help with web site. It was suggested that students do a presentation to Rotary to get money for printing etc. Two students contacted were Macey Barker and Sydney Chavez. We also need a website for the town with the library linked to it. It will cost \$14 a month for the domain name through WIX. Blue Host will be needed for security which will cost additional money. Lois will put it in the budget and hopefully we will get it. Londa will move forward on the website. Londa will try to get a book club started in February. We can email her with any new ideas for the web site.

Donna motioned for adjournment at 5:55 and Charlotte seconded. Motion carried.

Washburn Memorial Library Report for 2017

"A library is a focal point, a sacred place to a community; and its sacredness is accessibility, its publicness, it's everybody's place." Ursula Le Guin

The year 2017 promised to be a big year for Washburn Memorial Library. We were anxiously awaiting spring and the construction of ADA approved steps and ramp for the front of the library. As the spring months began to wane it became apparent that that particular project was not going to be completed. The board put out feelers for more concrete construction companies to place bids for the job but to no avail. I contacted the King Foundation who was the source of the grant. The foundation was understanding and allowed that when the project was complete to simply send them pictures of the completed project. The good news is that the board has accepted another bid and it looks like the job will be completed this coming spring.

Toddler Story Time met 17 times throughout the year. Jennifer Tanguay has done a wonderful job of entertaining anywhere from 3 to 19 children each time they met. Some of the times were themed some were tributes to a certain author. Many engaging stories were read, lots of movement with songs, coloring, crafts, puzzle making and snacking made up a typical hour. The children always had the opportunity to go upstairs after the hour and choose their own books.

Girls Scouts used the conference room 21 times this past year. They had an average attendance of 8 girls. They continue to meet here on Friday afternoons after school.

The CloudLibrary became a source for ebooks and audio books in March. The State library made that change from Overdrive. It is sometimes a challenge to borrow what you want from them but is a great way for the library to increase its circulation. For those who have Kindles, Nooks, Ereaders, smart phones, iphones, or even your personal computer it is a wonderful source for books that we don't have here at our library.

Washburn Memorial Library had 4,227 visitors this year. The public computers were used by those patrons 3,670 times. The summer months have the highest numbers with over 500 visits each for the months of June, July and August.

Circulation at the library saw 3,478 items checked out for the year. Three thousand five hundred twenty six items were checked back into the library. That means that we got some materials back that had been very much overdue. The Food For Fines program continues with folks being very generous in paying their fines with non-perishable food that helps to feed the hungry in Washburn.

The Interlibrary Loan program continues to be very valuable to patrons here but also to patrons of other libraries as we send out books from here to many other libraries.

The library added 56 new patrons to the roster this year, 23 adults, 20 children and 13 non-resident patrons. One patron borrowed 419 items from the library this past year. Paul Doiron's novels were circulated the most this year. Debbie Macomber, Mary Higgins Clark, James Patterson and David Baldacci are among the most popular authors. For children's books, Mo Willems books were taken out the most from the library.

This librarian is thankful to the Board of Trustees whose advice and guidance she finds extremely valuable in making the Washburn Memorial Library an essential part of the community.
